Your mandates

The first mandate consists of mapping abandoned sites on the traditional territory of the Algonquin Anishinabeg Nation (nine communities in Quebec) in order to develop interactive digital maps. The exhaustive portrait of abandoned sites must be carried out by drawing on the knowledge of the First Nations who occupy the territory. Site characterization and restoration will follow according to the action plan put forward for each community.

The second mandate consists of developing and carrying out one-off projects related to the environmental contamination of sites according to the needs of the communities.

Main responsibilities

- Develop the work plan of project activities and implement them.
- Develop a cartographic tool in collaboration with the geomatics sector.
- Conduct literature reviews and organize existing information.
- Organize public assemblies within the communities involved.
- Develop an action plan according to the results of the projects.
- Write funding applications.
- Participate and collaborate in various associated environmental characterization and site restoration projects.
- Develop training, organize events and advise communities on environmental contamination issues.
