# What about other hazardous waste?

In this container, we limit ourselves to used batteries, burned-out light bulbs, leftover household products and small out-of-use electronic products.

If you have other HHW, store them in a well-ventilated, cool and closed place in their original container.

Don't wait too long to take them to the ecocentre. Take the opportunity to empty your HHW box at the same time!

- Expired drugs are accepted in pharmacies and health centres
- Firearms and ammunition are accepted by the police service

## What to put in my HHW container?



BATTERIES

### ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS

Any small electronic device (cell phone, video game console, audio device, tablet, computer, etc).



Household hazardous waste (HHW) is a product that is used every day and has the potential to cause damage to health and the environment.

NEVER empty them into the sink, toilet or throw them in the garbage!
Instead, they should be taken to the ecocentre or a depot.



### How to recognize them?









In general they are identified by one of these symbols.

But some products, such as batteries, light bulbs or even paint, do not have any. If in doubt, contact your ecocentre or the Public Works or Environment Department.
